Dear Families, Caregivers, Factory and Kitchen Clients,

This has been a big year at Attainable Trust. In case you haven't heard, we've moved from Papatoetoe to Otara.

The move was spearheaded by our Chairman (Murray Clark), with support from management and our Board. Murray has been looking for a larger building for the past year due in large part to growth, and a desire to grow our kitchen and factory enterprises. Above all, we hope the move to the bigger location will allow us to hire more people with disabilities. It has been a long and arduous process to find the right location, but we are confident we will grow into our new space. Our new location is 50 Lovegrove Crescent, Otara. Our Community Participation group moved on 5 November, and the factory moved on 19 November. We are building a new kitchen which we hope will be available to move into at the beginning of January. It has been a busy time. We've had family meetings, Otara security and Business Association meetings and several debriefs with service users. We still have a ways to go with the work on the building, but the team knows bigger and better opportunities await us.

As a result of the move we are now looking at being able to do more work for our customers. We are talking to a large food importer to warehouse and label their food products. Community Participation now has more space to expand, and more outings will be planned for next year. Plans for the kitchen include a new bakery/café. This is exciting news for those that want to get a coffee, morning tea or lunch item. We are also talking with a café and other restaurants in the CBD about supplying bread products. Lots happening.

As in any year there are staff changes. I want to welcome the following new staff members: Shayla Rourangi joins us as a new QC specialist for the factory, Margy Hita has joined the kitchen as a Kitchen Supervisor, and Saman Gheisari has joined Community Participation as a staff member. Welcome to the team. I want to thank Claire, Nalini, Mary, Shelie, Rai, Julie, Saman, Walter, Margy, Shayla, Ally, and Wayne for all their hard work and dedication. You have all taken on additional responsibilities to help us transition to the new location.

In concluding, I want to thank The Board, Chairman Murray Clark for his leadership and tireless efforts to make the new building a reality, our kitchen and factory clients, our people, their families and caregivers, and our management team who have put in a huge effort this year.

KITCHEN REMAKE IN OTARA

The kitchen being planned in Otara will look nothing like the current kitchen. The new kitchen will be much bigger, and has been designed by a kitchen specialist. We are excited about the potential for the new kitchen to do a higher volume of work. The goal is to grow the kitchen business by opening a take-away café/bakery where families and the public can come and buy breads, pastries, and prepared meals, all home made by our kitchen staff.

Our plan is to do more lunches for area schools where we offer healthy selections from our kitchen. We hope to develop and sell prepared meals to the supermarkets, and to continue with our morning tea and lunch catering. We may also have an opportunity to work with Sky City to supply them bread products.

It is quite an ambitious plan with lots of opportunities available to us. This also means that we will be ramping up our staffing to bring in additional expertise and people that support our mission. At the end of the day our goal is for the additional business to provide more job opportunities for people with disabilities.

Lastly, we want to thank all of our customers who supported our kitchen this year. Your support means a lot to us. 2019 will be a big year for the kitchen so spread the word that we are opening a café/bakery. Do you have any suggestions for a name for the new café/bakery?




